I. Assessing and Treating Sexual Offenders

Presenter: Anna Salter, Ph.D.

This workshop will focus on current research and issues related to sex offender assessment and treatment. Areas covered include: What's New in the Area of Assessment of Sexual Offenders; Adult and Child Pornography and its Influence on Sexual Offending; Treatment Components: Which Ones Work to Reduce Offending; and Staff Predators (offenders who seduce and manipulate staff). Risk assessment, in particular, has changed in the last two years. Revisions to Static99 introduced in the fall of 2009 have highlighted the issue of risk in older offenders (i.e. cases in which older offenders have reoffended recently). This workshop will discuss these changes along with a discussion of the exceptions to the general trend of reduced offending in older offenders. The role of pornography will be described along with a discussion of child pornography and its relationship to sexual offending. Of particular concern is whether those who use child pornography typically have hands-on victims or not. Treatment components will be addressed including which treatments appear to reduce offending and which do not. The workshop will end with a discussion on the techniques used by staff predators to manipulate staff.

II. Sex Offenders In A Digital World: Assessment, Management, and Personal Protection Presenter: James Tanner, Ph.D.

Sex offenders, like the rest of us, have embraced the digital world. This workshop provides vital information about the assessment and management of sex offenders' digital life. Dr. Tanner is nationally recognized for his clear (non-geek-speak), lively, and comprehensive approach to training professionals. Participants at all levels of expertise will walk away with a fuller understanding of how sex offenders use digital technology, how we can assess their involvement, and how we can manage and monitor their digital activity. As an added bonus, the workshop will conclude with valuable information on how to protect yourself, your data, and your family from digital compromise. If you work with sex offenders who own computers, this is a must attend workshop. Areas to be covered include: Why Assess Digital Elements; Technology Overview; What's Out There: A Taxonomy of Sex on the Web; Assessment; Management Strategies; Personal and Professional Protection.

III. Comprehensive Risk Assessments for Adolescents Who Have Offended Sexually: With a Focus On the ERASOR (Estimate of Risk of Adolescent Sexual Offense Recidivism) Presenter: James R. Worling, Ph.D., C.Psych

This workshop will focus on providing practical information and strategies for professionals who provide assessments for adolescents who have offended sexually. Using lecture, case studies, discussion, limited role play, and resource materials, participants will cover the following major topic areas: risky assumptions in working with adolescents who offend sexually; heterogeneity among adolescents who offend sexually; importance of a comprehensive assessment; different approaches to risk assessment; development and coding of the ERASOR (Estimate of Risk of Adolescent Sexual Offense Recidivism); a structured professional judgment tool for estimating the short-term risk of an adolescent sexual reoffense; research regarding the reliability and validity of the ERASOR; ethical issues involved in communicating risk-assessment findings; informed consent process for adolescents who have offended sexually; tips and techniques for the clinical interview; and the assessment report.

Deception Detection

Dr. James Tanner will present on how to tell when someone is editing something out of a verbal or written statement. This session will cover the basics of truth and deception. He will review common approaches to lie detection and then explore Discourse Analysis, a lexical and syntactical approach to analyzing statements. Using clear examples, Dr. Tanner will explain how a respondent's shifts in words and grammar can point interviewers to "hot spots" in a statement that need to be probed. You will never listen to a conversation or interview the same way again after you attend this session.

Things We Think We Know: Ten Interesting Ideas and the Exercise of Critical Thinking in Our Work With Sexually Abusive Youth

This presentation will look at the state of knowledge and belief systems in our field, and the manner in which we come to accept or reject ideas. Dr. Rich will examine and discuss ten current ideas, beliefs, practices, or directions in our field that have at least two sides to them. These will include ideas about research-driven practice and the nature of empirical evidence; actuarial versus clinical assessment; the nature and global application of trauma-informed models of treatment; the nature of sexually abusive youth as distinct from or merely a variant of juvenile delinquency; the role and function of denial in risk assessment and treatment; the nature of emerging adolescent antisociality as psychopathy or developmental outcome; iatrogenic effects in the treatment of antisocial youths; and the application of homogeneous thinking to a heterogeneous population.

James Tanner, Ph.D.

Dr. James Tanner has been a community corrections professional since 1970. He earned his Ph.D. in Sociology from the University of Illinois with specialties in Cognitive Social Psychology (Linguistics/Phenomenology), Sociology of Law, and Evaluation Research. He served on the faculty of three universities where he taught at both graduate and undergraduate levels. He specializes in the management of convicted sex offenders. He and Dr. Stephen Brake developed the Structured Sex Offender Treatment Review (SSOTR), a tool which allows professionals to monitor the progress of sex offenders in treatment. He is a nationally recognized cybercrime analyst who has examined more than 1,300 sex offenders' computers and designed Field Search, a computer investigation software application distributed free to law enforcement through NLECTC. Field Search is in use in the United States, Canada, UK, Australia, Europe, and by the U.S. Military.

Dr. Tanner has presented hundreds of seminars and workshops and trained thousands of professionals at the national, state, and local level. Consultation and training clients include the U.S. Department of Justice, Project Safe Childhood, U.S. Department of Defense, American Probation and Parole Association, Center for Sex Offender Management, National Law Enforcement and Corrections Technology Center, High Technology Crime Investigation Association (HTCIA), Internet Crimes Against Children Task Force (ICAC), Probation/Parole Departments in 32 states, Mental Health Organizations in 5 states, and Child Welfare agencies in 7 states.

Phil Rich, Ed.D., LICSW

Phil Rich is the author of *Understanding Juvenile Sexual Offenders: Assessment, Treatment, and Rehabilitation* and Attachment *and Sexual Offending: Understanding and Applying Attachment Theory to the Treatment of Juvenile Sexual Offenders.* Phil is the Clinical Director of the Stetson School, a 111-bed long term residential treatment program for juvenile sexual offenders and sexually reactive children in Massachusetts, where he supervises a clinical team consisting of 17 clinicians, and 8 case managers. He has practiced as a clinical social worker for over 27 years, has served as the program director of five residential and day treatment programs, and has worked extensively with troubled adolescents and adults in residential, inpatient, day treatment, and outpatient settings.

Anna Salter, Ph.D.

Dr. Salter received her Ph.D. in Clinical Psychology and Public Practice from Harvard University and obtained a Masters Degree in Child Study from Tufts. She was a Teaching Fellow at both Universities. Dr. Salter has lived in Madison Wisconsin since 1996 and consults half time to the Wisconsin Department of Corrections. In addition, she lectures and consults on sex offenders and victims throughout the United States and abroad. Dr. Salter also evaluates sex offenders for civil commitment proceedings and other purposes. She testifies as an expert witness in sexual abuse civil and criminal cases.

Before moving to Madison, Dr. Salter was on the faculty of Dartmouth Medical School in Lebanon, New Hampshire in the Departments of Psychiatry and Maternal and Child Health. While there, she was Director of Psycho-social Training for the Pediatric Residency Program, Director of Child Psychiatry Consultation to the Pediatric Ward, Co-Director of the Parenting Clinic, Assistant Director of the Children-at-Risk Program and Director of the Parents in Distress Program. Dr. Salter is the 1997 winner of the Significant Achievement Award from the Association for the Treatment of Sexual Abusers. She is the author of three nonfiction books: Predators: Pedophiles, Rapists and Other Sex Offenders: Who They Are, How They Operate and How We Can Protect Ourselves and Our Children; Transforming Trauma: A Guide to Understanding and Treating Adult Survivors of Child Sexual Abuse; and Treating Child Sex Offenders and Victims: A Practical Guide.

James R. Worling, Ph.D., C.Psych.

Dr. Worling is a clinical and forensic psychologist who has worked extensively with adolescents who sexually offend, and their families, since 1988. During this time, he has presented many workshops throughout Canada and internationally, and he has written a number of professional articles and book chapters regarding the etiology, assessment, and treatment of adolescent sexual aggression. In addition to his full-time consulting and clinical practice, he is presently an associate faculty member at the University of Toronto, and he serves on the Editorial Boards for *Sexual Abuse: A Journal of Research & Treatment* and *Child Abuse & Neglect*.
