**I. Assessment and Treatment of High Risk Sexual Offenders:**

**Practical Guidelines for Clinicians**

**Presenter: Jan Looman, Ph.D., C. Psych.**

The assessment and treatment of high risk sexual offenders, particularly those who meet the diagnostic criteria for psychopathy, presents a variety of unique challenges to clinicians. In fact, there is debate in the literature as to whether such high risk clients (particularly those who meet the diagnostic criteria for psychopathy on the Hare Psychopathy Checklist-Revised [PCL-R]) are even amenable to treatment. The workshop will focus on sexual offenders who are at high risk of recidivism. The presentation will begin with a review of the research relevant to the assessment and treatment of high risk sexual offenders, with a focus on what the recent outcome literature has shown regarding the treatment efficacy with psychopathic offenders.

Topics also include: an integrated approach to the treatment of high risk sex offenders starting with in-patient based institutional treatment and ending with community-based follow-up; the application of these interventions with high risk, psychopathic offenders in particular; and issues related to treatment responsivity in high risk sex offenders. Participants will be given opportunities to ask questions and engage in discussions regarding how they have attempted to address important treatment issues with sexual offenders.

**II. The Current State of Assessing and Treating Adolescents who Have Sexually Abused**

**Presenter: David Prescott, LICSW**

This workshop provides an overview of recent research into young people who have sexually abused. It discusses implications for assessment, treatment, prevention, and policy. Although more research is needed, there have been a number of recent findings in areas such as risk assessment, sexual victimization history, self-report of offense-related arousal, etc. that can inform practice. As is the case elsewhere in the assessment and treatment of sexual abusers, much of what our field thought 25 years ago has -- in most cases -- turned out to be wrong. Numerous authors (including the presenter) have written on the importance of understanding how adolescents differ from their adult counterparts. Recent research illustrates this more completely. This workshop combines didactic and interactive elements in order to best facilitate learning. Numerous resources for further study are provided.

**III. Scoring and Interpreting the PCL-R**

**Presenter: Joel Lord, Ph.D.**

This session is a day-long training in the use of the PCL-R. Dr. Lord will begin the day providing an introduction to the PCL-R. This will include an overview of how the PCL-R impacts our understanding of psychopathy and how our evolving knowledge of psychopaths impacts our understanding of the PCL-R. The session will focus on scoring the PCL-R starting with a review of the materials with an emphasis on the common practical uses of the technical manual. The session will briefly review Robert Hare's book, *Without Conscience*, and demonstrate how it should inform your understanding of the item scoring guidelines. Finally, participants will have an opportunity to score several sample cases. This session is expected to be useful for individuals who want to begin to use the PCL-R as well as for individuals who are looking for a refresher.

*Engaging Bystanders: Learning from the Penn State Tragedy to Proactively Engage Families, Social Networks and Organizations*



When the public is overwhelmed with emerging stories of sexual abuse and the lack of proactive responses, it is a unique opportunity to deepen the public's understanding and involvement. For the first time, people are asking for information about the people who sexually abuse and those who know them. Treatment providers and other professionals are in a unique position to inform this discussion and to move beyond their traditional practice to work with families, social networks, and organizations. Because proactive approaches rarely come to light, a few shining examples will be highlighted where colleagues created opportunities for prevention, policies to helpfully intervene when some one may be at risk to sexually abuse, and proactive responses by communities when an abuser returns to their community.

*Media Matters: Practical Guidelines for Responding to High-Profile Sexual Violence Cases*



Sexual violence impacts one in four women and one in six men, and its ripple effect on our families, workplaces, and communities is profound and far-reaching. Yet many in the media continue to perpetuate damaging myths about rape, while blaming the victim. In this keynote address, Anne K. Ream explores how we can change that, positing that initiating a strategic and creative dialogue with editors, journalists, and opinion shapers is critical to impacting media coverage. Using real-world case studies and examples of what works (and what doesn't) when responding to high-profile media cases, and exploring how new media vehicles -- and user generated content -- can change the game for the anti-violence movement, this interactive lecture/slide program provides tools that can be used by advocates, allies, prosecutors, and law enforcement personnel, as well as other professionals working in the field dealing with the media in their work.

*RNR vs. GLM: Fundamental Differences or Much Ado about Nothing?*



This plenary session will describe the similarities and differences between Risk-Needs-Responsivity (RNR) and the Good Lives Model (GLM) approaches to the treatment of offenders. This will include their respective perspectives on humankind, their theoretical bases, their use of risks versus strengths, and criminogenic needs versus goods. These approaches will also be reviewed in terms of empirical evidence and clinicians' satisfaction. Key questions that will be addressed include the following: How does this dialogue contribute to the design and delivery of treatment programs for sexual offenders? Can these competing perspectives be reconciled and, if so, how? Finally, what are the lessons to be learned from this debate?
